## **Collective Memory-Work**



Collective Memory-Work (CMW) is a method for: research, learning, reflection. Collective - because we **work together as** a collective in a **group**; Memory - because our working material are **memories of** our **own experiences**; Work - because we don't stop at sharing memories, rather we will **work on and with them**. In contrast to history workshops in which the focus is on collective cultural memories, we are **working collectively with individual memories**.

As a method for learning it addresses multiple dimensions (language, analytic thought and argumentation, extended perspectives on personal history). As a method for reflection it opens up a view on society as lived practice in historically situated social relations. As a method for research it opens the possibility to overcome the researcher | researched divide.

**Process:** For CMW the group needs a topic. We start with the notion of "Touch." In an initial discussion we find a shared topical focus. We agree on a writing trigger. We write short memory-scenes. We work with the memory-sceces according to a distinct text-analytical procedure. We refer back to our introductory discussion. The various steps in the process will be made transparent. In the concluding discussion we will look at adaptations and possible fields for application of the method.
